Frank Baum Vladimir Nabokov Jimmy Carter George Bush Saddam Hussein and Henry Kissinger these profiles make intriguing reading for example Elms discusses the fiction of Isaac Asimov in light of the latter's acrophobia fear of heights and mild agoraphobia fear of open spaces and Elms includes excerpts from a series of letters between himself and Asimov he reveals an unintended subtext of *The Wizard of Oz* that males are weak females are strong think of Scarecrow Tin Man the Lion and the Wizard versus the good and bad witches and Dorothy herself and traces this in part to Baum's childhood heart disease which kept him from strenuous activity and to his relationship with his mother in law Matilda Joselyn Gage a distinguished advocate of women's rights and in a fascinating chapter he examines the abused childhood of Saddam Hussein the privileged childhood of George Bush and the radically different psychological paths that led these two men into the Persian Gulf War Elms supports each study with extensive research much of it never presented before for instance on how some of the most revealing portions of C. G. Jung's autobiography were deleted in spite of his protests before publication along the way Elms provides much insight into how psychobiography is written finally he proposes clear guidelines for judging high quality work and offers practical tips for anyone interested in writing in this genre written with great clarity and wit *Uncovering Lives* illuminates the contributions that psychology can make to biography Elms's enthusiasm for his subject is contagious and will inspire
